Our Speakers:

Darren Davis, CGCS, has been superintendent at Olde Florida Golf Club in Naples, Florida since 1992. He was elected as the 82nd president of GCSAA in 2018, His commitment to the association has continued and Davis is presently the GCSAA Centennial Celebration Committee Chair—a position he will hold through the association's 100 year anniversary on September 13, 2026. Davis has received recognition on both the national level and Florida state level. He is a twotime winner of the GCSAA Leo Feser Award and was honored with a GCSAA National Environmental Steward Award in the private course division. Davis graduated with highest distinction in 1991 from the turfgrass management program at Pennsylvania State University, obtained an Associate in Arts Degree from Tallahassee Community College in 1987, and in 2007, Florida Gulf Coast University conferred upon him a Bachelor of Arts in Communication, Summa Cum Laude.

Paul Koch, Ph.D., is an associate professor in the Department of Plant Pathology as well as the

Molecular and Environmental Toxicology Center at the University of Wisconsin - Madison, joining the faculty in January of 2014. Koch's research has focused primarily on (1) the impact of environmental conditions on fungicide breakdown in the environment and (2) snow mold diseases on golf course turfgrass. Koch also oversees the University of Wisconsin Turfgrass Diagnostic Lab and the University of Wisconsin Turfgrass Fungicide Testing Program. The UW Turfgrass Fungicide Testing Program is one of the largest of its kind in the country and tests approximately 200 fungicide treatments annually for efficacy against both winter and summer turfgrass diseases. Koch received his Ph.D, from University of Wisconsin – Madison with a major in plant pathology and a minor in molecular and environmental toxicology.

Chas Schmid, Ph.D., is a research associate in the turfgrass program at Oregon State University where he conducts applied turfgrass research and teaches undergraduate and PACE courses. Schmid is a South Dakota native who received his B.S. in horticulture, his M.S. in agronomy from the University of Nebraska, and his Ph.D. in plant biology and pathology from Rutgers University. His research interests include the management of organic matter in putting greens, the impact of cultural management practices such as soil nutrition and soil pH on anthracnose disease of putting greens, and turfgrass cultivar evaluations.
