Chris Carson is the superintendent emeritus at Echo Lake Country Club in Westfield, NJ, where he recently concluded a successful 36-year career. During his tenure, a complete master plan rebuild of the course was completed, two USGA Championships were held and 11 assistants have moved on to become superintendents. He has also spent the last 25 years teaching Professional Development and Budgeting/Planning in the Rutgers Professional Golf Turf Management Program. Carson has presented over 100 talks and seminars throughout the country and is an accomplished writer for Golf Course Management magazine with over 25 published articles, twice winning GCSAA's Leo Feser Award.

Thomas A. Nikolai, Ph.D., has been performing turfgrass research and teaching at Michigan State University since 1992. Areas of research interest include cultural and mechanical practices and their relevance to decreasing inputs. University courses Nikolai has taught include Turfgrass and the Environment, Pesticide and Fertilizer Technology, World of Soils, Turfgrass Irrigation, Turfgrass Management and Turf and

Landscape Analytical Practices. Nikolai has given presentations in 31 countries, 8 Canadian Provinces, and 40 States.
